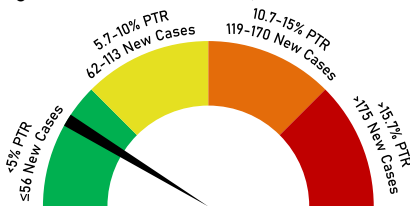

For testing site please go online at [www.gogettested.com](http://www.gogettested.com). The site will allow those wanting to be tested to choose their testing site, time, and will take you through a short series of screening questions. You should be able to drive through be tested at your designated time and results will come back to you in approximately 48 hours via e-mail or text however you designate that you want to be contacted. Testing is a saliva test and you don't have to have an appointment to get tested, although it's not required.

Emergency Management Reminders:

- Reno County Commissioner declared a public health emergency on March 19, 2020 and extended this disaster declaration to June 30, 2021
- The state disaster declaration is extended until May 28, 2021

# STATE OF KANSAS UPDATES

6/2/2021: One-Hundred and one (101) counties, as well as all Native American tribes in Kansas, have a valid state of local disaster declarations on file. The Legislative Coordinating Council (LCC) has extended the declaration until June 15, 2021. However, the LCC did decide to revoke Governor Kelly's evictions and foreclosure moratorium.

In preparation for the declaration expiring on June 15, 2021, SEOC Staff have begun planning for the closure of the non-congregate shelters within the state. SEOC staff monitored flooding in a few areas of the state. Middle School vaccinations have continued throughout the week and the KSNG and contract nursing staff have continued administering vaccines. Logistics fulfilled stakeholder requests.
